

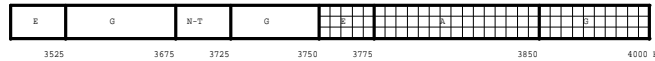

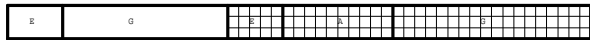

Entire 12 meter segment open to General or above.




